Sankei-en Garden























Facility Overview

The Sankei-en Garden was built by Hara Tomitaro (Hara Sankei), a businessperson who built his fortune through raw silk trading and was also known as a tea master and art collector. It has been open to the public since 1906. The garden is home to 17 historical structures that have been transferred over from Kyoto, Kamakura, and other locations in Japan, and 10 of these buildings are designated as important cultural properties.

Highlights

The garden boasts a three-storied pagoda, a tearoom, and other structures that make use of the undulations of an expansive plot of land equivalent to four Tokyo Domes. Flowers including plum, cherry, wisteria, lotus, and rhododendron bloom throughout the four seasons, and the garden is also famous for its vivid spring greens and autumn leaves. The combination of these stunning colors and the garden's structures are a sight to behold. Some of the garden's buildings are used to entertain important quests from Japan and overseas, to hold meetings and banquets, to host cultural experiences, and more.
