Fujiko·F·Fujio Museum in Kawasaki City



















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Facility Overview

The museum features original artwork and related materials by manga creator Fujiko F. Fujio, who was a long-time resident of Tama Ward in Kawasaki City. It was opened in 2011 in line with his wife's wish to "give back to the children who supported my husband's manga."

Highlights

The museum is full of spots where visitors can experience the world of Doraemon. They can enjoy some mysterious experiences at the Minna no Hiroba, read different comics in the Manga Corner, and see the famous clay pipes and the Anywhere Door at the Harappa rooftop area. Familiar characters from the comic can be found throughout the museum, too.

Details/Schedule

Visits to the museum are by booking only. Tickets are not sold at the museum, and so bookings must be made in advance on the website. If there is space available on the day, same-day bookings can be made up to 45 minutes before the planned time of entry. Visitors cannot enter the museum earlier than the time shown on their ticket or if they are 60 minutes later than the time shown. However, there is no limit on how much time visitors can spend in the museum and they are free to stay until closing.
