Facility Overview

Hase Ceramics Workshop is a pottery workshop in the Hase area of Kamakura. Visitors can take part in three casual programs: the electric pottery wheel program, the hand building program, and the Buddhist statue program. Each program takes around an hour, making the workshop the perfect place to stop off at during some local sightseeing.

Highlights

With kind and careful guidance, even beginners can use the electric pottery wheel to form their own creations. Those who want to make something with a handle or with a different shape should join the hand building program. After being dried and fired, the creations are sent to the participants' homes.

- Electric pottery wheel program: Experience the true charm of pottery. Perfect for making round items.

Price: 5,500 yen (tax included; firing of one item included; delivery fee separate)

- Buddhist statue program: Create a palm-sized Buddhist statue using a plater mold.
