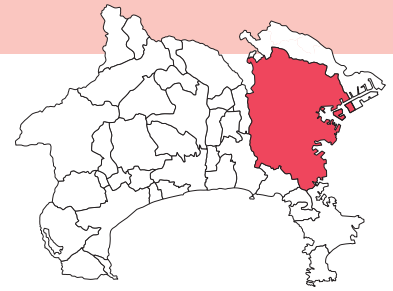

City of civilization and enlightenment, Yokohama is also a city of fashion. Visitors can hire Yokohama-style kimonos at Yokohama Kimono Station located in Yamashita-cho near Yamashita Park. The Station is 5 mins by foot from Yamashita Park, Osanbashi Bridge and Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse so you can choose your preferred background to take photos. The Station has a range of around 100 kimonos and all required accessories can be rented. We recommend the special plan for tourists that includes a rickshaw ride.
