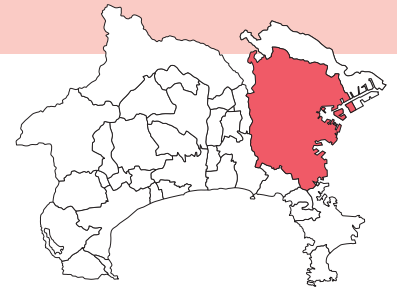

**Yamashita Park**



Explanation of  
 Tourist Attraction

A sea park opened in 1930, built using reclaimed land and debris gathered during rebuilding efforts after the Great Kantō Earthquake. At the park, you can see a statue of a girl wearing red shoes from Ujō Noguchi's children's song Akai Kutsu (Red Shoes), as well as other monuments, including a dedication to the song Kamome No Suihei San (Seagull Sailor), and an Indian Water Tower. Also, the luxury liner Hikawa Maru is moored within the park and is very popular with tourists and families throughout the year.

Yamashita Park is also well known for its roses. Based on the theme of Rose Gardens of the Future, the park has been arranged to show the history of the rose from past through to the future.

**Harbor View Park**



This park is located atop a small hill overlooking the Port of Yokohama. Here you can delight in a breath-taking view of the Yokohama Bay Bridge. Harbor View Park is known for boasting the most roses in Yokohama.

Successful silk merchant Tomitaro Hara opened an expansive Japanese garden here in 1906. On the grounds you will find historical buildings that were relocated from Kyoto and Kamakura.
