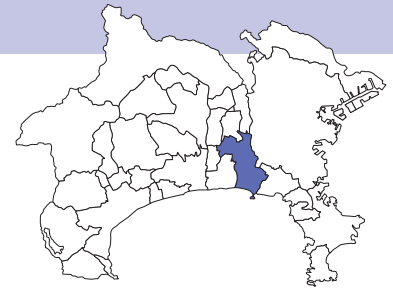

Enoshima Samuel Cocking Garden



Explanation of
Tourist Attraction

Started by Samuel Cocking, an English trader during the Meiji period, this botanical garden blends Japanese and Western styles with an overflowing tropical atmosphere. You can see flowers and other types of vegetation that represent nature over all four seasons. Also, housed within the Samuel Cocking Garden, also known as the Enoshima Tropical Plants Garden, is the Enoshima Sea Candle (observatory lighthouse), which is affectionately recognized as a symbol of Shonan. From here you can enjoy a full 360 degree view of the scenery, including Mt. Fuji, the Izu Peninsula, Hakone, and the Tanzawa Mountains.

A shrine located on the island of Enoshima. It was founded in the year 552 and "Hetsumiya," "Nakatsumiya," and "Okutsumiya," scattered throughout the island, are collectively called Enoshima Shrine. In recent years, it has been garnering attention as a location for filming romance films.
