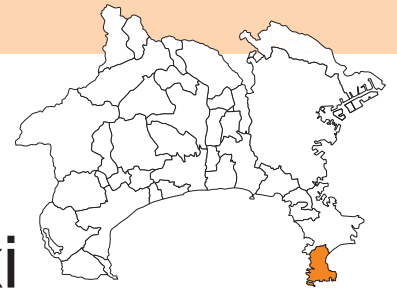

Quiet Harbour Town and Maguro Tuna Cuisine

Miura Peninsula – Downtown Area of Misaki



Explanation of Tourist Attraction

The Misaki District in Miura City on the Miura Peninsula is 70 mins from central Tokyo and Haneda Airport by car or train on the Keikyu Line. This area has flourished as a deep-sea fishing port town since ancient times. There are restaurants, hotels and a market (Urari) that are focused on fresh maguro tuna cuisine and visitors can enjoy wandering around the port town, authentic maguro cuisine and shopping for fresh seafood. The Chakkirako Festival at Kainan Shrine, which is thought to be flowing with mystical energy, is registered as a UNESCO intangible cultural property.

Visitors can buy products including maguro tuna from the Miura Peninsula at Misaki Fisharina Wharf Urari Marche.

Mitomi Somemono Tenn



Founded in 1833, this is an established workshop where Tokugawa Shogunate artisans worked. The Tairyō-bata (big fish catch flags) are included in the top 100 famous products of Kanagawa Prefecture and are used not only for newly constructed vessels but also for celebrations such as weddings, the birth of a child or 60th birthdays. Kainan Shrine



This shrine was a place of worship for the Miura Clan and has been venerated since the reign of Emperor Seiwa as the local Shinto deity of the Miura Peninsula. The grounds boast an 800 year old large ginkgo tree from Minamoto no Yorimoto Kishin.
