 Tourist Attraction

Nihon Minka-en, located in the northern part of Kawasaki City just 30 minutes by car from Tokyo and 40 minutes from Haneda Airport, is an open-air museum showcasing 25 buildings such as traditional Japanese homes, a water mill and a Kabuki stage. Visitors can also enjoy an indigo dye experience in the traditional crafts center, one of the facility of Nihon Minka-en. Admission fee: Groups of 20 persons or more = 400 yen each. (Regular fee = 500 yen)
