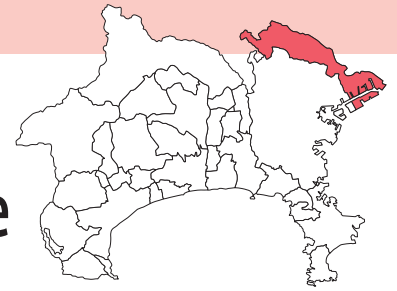

## Keihin Fushimi Inari Shrine



Explanation of  
Tourist Attraction

A 2-minutes walk from the closest station of Shin-Maruko, this is a shrine located in Nakahara-ku, Kawasaki City. After the war, it was built with the wish of the city's revitalization in mind at the request of "Fushimi Inari Taisha", the headquarters of the Inari faith in Kyoto. Highlights include a vermilion main hall, a large metal torii gate approximately 14 meters tall, a colossal 3-meter tall Shinkyo (sacred mirror), an area with a collection of torii gates, and a miniature figure of Mt. Fuji made from the lava of Mt. Fuji.

selling point

There are 108 statues of kitsune (fox), or divine messengers, and many non-Japanese tourists come visit for the purpose of seeing them. The facial expressions and poses of the kitsune statues are dynamic, charming and fascinating those who visit.

### Kawasaki Racecourse(watch races, go horseback riding, etc.)



An amusement spot in Kawasaki that is very popular between March and December owing to the races being held at night. The final race is not until 20:50, so it is easy to drop by even as the evening wears on.

### Daihonzan Kawasaki Daishi Heikenji-Temple



This is a very famous spot that is visited by more than ten million people a year. It is known for Yakuyoke Daishi, a temple which wards off evil. Every day, the Gomakito ritual to pray for the fulfillment of the many prayers of believers is held.
