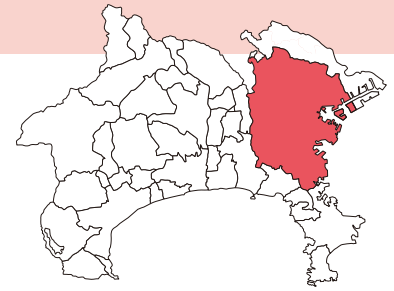

in Yokohama

Explanation of
Tourist Attraction

Approx. 30 mins from central Tokyo and Haneda Airport by car, or the JR·Keihin Kyuko Line. This is a separate temple from Naritasan Shinshoji in Chiba Prefecture and many believers gather here. Naritasan's unique ritual "Goma" consists of burning prayer sticks in front of the "Fudomyoo", the idol of this temple, to answer the prayers of the temple visitors. This ritual is conducted 4 times a day (9:00, 11:00, 13:00 and 15:00) and anyone can participate freely.

Services/Activities

No admission fee. Goma: We recommend that visitors dedicate prayer sticks (500 – 1,000 yen) and write their prayers and names on the sticks which will then be burned.

Kamonyama Park (famous for cherry blossom)



Located on elevated land that looks out over Yokohama Minato Mirai 21, this park houses a bronze statue of Naosuke Ii. It is famous for its cherry blossom and is crowded with visitors during the blossom season.

Iseyama Kotai Jingu



This shrine enshrines Yokohama's local Shinto deity, Amaterasu Omikami (Sun Goddess) and is known as the Oisesan of Kanto. The cherry blossom that blooms beside the steps within the grounds is spectacular.
