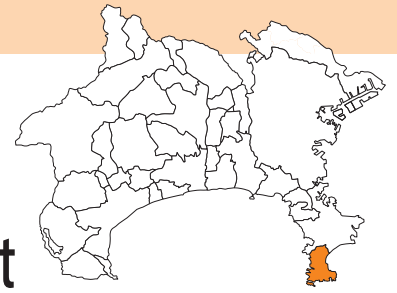

A 3D walk underwater

The Niziuro Sakana, an Underwater Sightseeing Boat



Explanation of Tourist Attraction

The Niziuro Sakana is a semi-submersible tourist boat that floats around Misaki port, allowing you to casually enjoy a stroll in the sea. You can see into the ocean through the glass floor. The boat travels on as you explore the beautiful waters. Seeing fish in their natural habitat is what sets this apart from an aquarium. You can see many fish swimming around, including pearl-spot chromis, opaleyes, grass pufferfish, and black surfperch. Different from a conventional glass-bottom boat, you can enjoy a 3D walk in the ocean from the underwater room, complete with climate control.

Retro Misaki Shopping arcade



The Misaki area, flourishing as a base for deep-sea fishing, features restaurants, inns, and markets (Urari Marche) centered around tuna cuisine, and you can enjoy walking in this port town and buying fresh products from the sea.

Mitomi Somemono Tenn



Founded in 1833, this is an established workshop where Tokugawa Shogunate artisans worked. The Tairyo-bata (big fish catch flags) are included in the top 100 famous products of Kanagawa Prefecture and are used not only for newly constructed vessels but also for celebrations such as weddings, the birth of a child or 60th birthdays.
