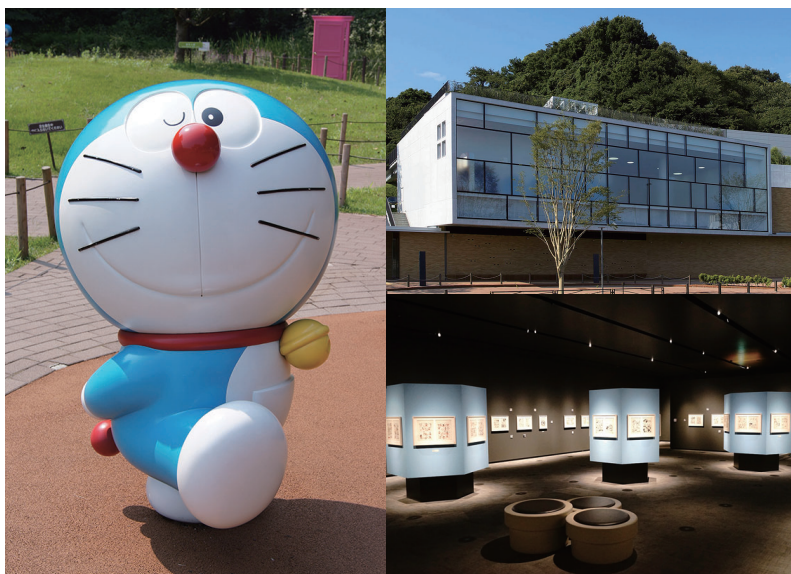

Ikuta Ryokuchi Rose Garden



The garden is surrounded by the woodlands of Tama Hills, an area that blooms with roses twice a year with roughly 4,700 bushes of 530 varieties in springtime and 4,000 bushes of 440 varieties in the fall. The roses and facilities are nurtured and maintained through cooperation with countless citizen volunteers.
