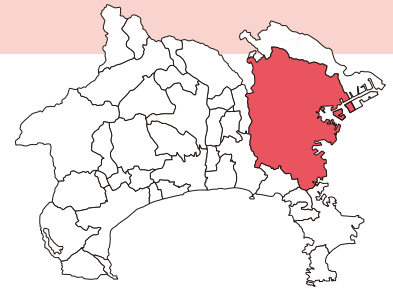

Ehrismann ResidenceExplanation of
Tourist Attraction

The Ehrismann Residence was the home of Fritz Ehrismann who worked as the Yokohama manager for a raw silk trading company. It was built at 127 Yamatecho in 1926 by A. Raymond, known as the Father of Modern Japanese Architecture for his large influence on Japanese architecture. Currently, the house sits in Motomachi Park after being moved and reconstructed. On the first floor is a drawing room with a fireplace and a living room-dining room. The sunroom with views of the garden includes furniture constructed by Raymond, and the 2nd floor houses an exhibition related to the Yamate Seiyokan. The old kitchen serves as a tea room, and the underground hall can be rented and used.

Yokohama Chinatown

The largest Chinatown in Japan and East Asia is found in the vicinity of Yamashita-cho, Naka ward, Yokohama City. There are more than 500 shops, and 6,000 Chinese people live within an area of about 0.2km²

Sankei-en

A large Japanese garden opened in 1906 by businessman Hara Sankei, who became wealthy through raw silk trading. There are many historical buildings brought and reconstructed here from Kyoto and Kamakura.
