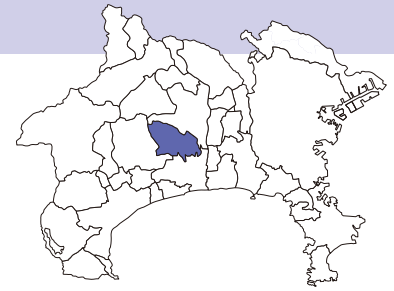

Tourist Attraction

Oyama has been a place of mountain worship since ancient times and was as popular as Mt. Fuji as a holy mountain in the Edo Period. At the centre is the Oyama Afuri Shrine and hotels were developed from pilgrims' lodgings for Afuri Shrine (originally Afuriyama Oyama Temple in ancient times). Currently, there is a total of 46 places to stay and each of these has its own sanctuary. Visitors can experience Japanese culture here.
