# Hakone Venetian Glass Museum

## Explanation of Tourist Attraction

This museum exhibits about 100 pieces of Venetian glass that charmed the royalty of Europe in the Middle Ages. The museum, with its sprawling European garden modeled after royal European villas, features a popular restaurant where you can hear a live Italian singer performing canzoni songs, a museum shop that offers glass imported directly from all over the world, and a studio workshop. There is a 9-meter tall, 10-meter long crystal glass arch leading from the garden to the Venetian Glass Museum entrance. About 160,000 pieces of crystal glass sparkle in the breeze that blows through Hakone, offering a plethora of emotions.

## Mount Taikan



Mount Taikan is located on the border of Hakone and Yugawara, and offers outstanding views of Mount Fuji and Lake Ashi. It is named after Yokoyama Taikan, an artist who is said to have painted Mount Fuji often because he loved it.

## Lake Ashi Pleasure Boat



The Lake Ashi Pleasure Boat began operation in 1920, originally as a catamaran. It currently operates as a schedule ferry between the four ports of Hakone Sekishoato, Motohakone, Hakone-en, and Kojiri, and you can also enjoy riding it as a pleasure boat and getting off at the same port that you boarded at.
