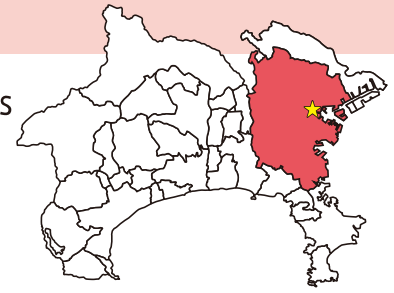

 Tourist Attraction

With a concept of "seeing, touching, and enjoying "the real thing", Keikyu Museum was established as a part of the 120th-anniversary project. In the museum, historical train "Keikyu DEHA 230 Type" which was running in the early Showa Period is displayed after being restored for about 2 years. Furthermore, there are many exhibits and hands-on-experience areas such as "Keikyu Line Georama" that copied the scenery of the Keikyu Line, "Train Simulation" where you can experience operating the train, and "My Train Factory" where you can craft your own train.



Selling point



There are displays and exhibits that can be enjoyed by children and adults alike. With an actual train on display, the museum conveys the history of the Keikyu Group along with its present and future, creating a lively atmosphere in the Minatomirai area of Yokohama.
