Hakone Kyukaido Road of Cedar Trees



Explanation of Tourist Attraction Hakone Kyukaido Road was established as part of the Tokaido Road by the Tokugawa Shogunate in the early Edo period. It refers to the 32 km route that went from Mishima-shuku, through the Hakone Pass, and down to Odawara-juku. This was the most difficult part of the Tokaido Road, as the path from Mishima-shuku to the Hakone checkpoint goes through the Hakone Pass with an elevation of 846 m, and if it rained or snowed, the traveler would have been up to his knees in mud all the way. Today, only about 2 km of the original stone pavement remains, but walking along this pavement gives you a chance to imagine yourself traveling along this path as if you were alive then.
