Tanakaya

Explanation of Tourist Attraction

The old Tokaido highway passes in front of this restaurant—in fact, Sakuraya as depicted in the famous woodblock print of Kanagawa-juku by artist Utagawa Hiroshige was the predecessor to modern-day Tanakaya. Kanagawa-juku, a post town along the Tokaido, boasted about 1,300 houses and buildings (including officially designated and standard inns, tea houses, and more) during its period of greatest prosperity. The establishment that would become Tanakaya was among these, and today it is the only remaining part of this post town, holding the title of Yokohama's oldest ryotei traditional-style restaurant. The restaurant has been in business for more than 150 years in the same spot, and during the Meiji Period (1868–1912) Oryo, wife of celebrated revolutionary Sakamoto Ryoma, worked here as a member of the customer service staff. Today, guests at Tanakaya can savor this rich history while enjoying a relaxing meal.
