Explanation of Tourist Attraction

This store was established in the 4th year of Tenpo. During the Edo era, the craftsmen were shogunal purveyors. They mainly dyed large size flags and eventually dyed Tairyō-bata. They were usually used to celebrate the newly built ships, however, lately they are also used for weddings, birth of a child, seasonal festivals, opening of new stores, and for celebrating 60th, 70th and 88th birthdays. Every one of them is handmade and at their workshop, visitors can dye their own flags. Experience the traditional technique passed down from the Edo era.
