An experience-based park where you can enjoy the agriculture and sea of the Miura Peninsula. This park surrounded by the sea is full of charm and appeal with blooming flowers in all seasons, an agricultural area where you can experience seasonal vegetable harvesting, plenty of activities (fun Go-kart, Hill sledding, etc.), workshops (bread, arts and crafts, etc.), agriculture and ocean-themed restaurants, and an animal area where you can see capybara, kangaroos, and more.

Orange Picking (Miura Mikan Picking Association)



Enjoy the taste of Autumn in Miura with the family or as a large group. Groups under 25 members can come without reservations. You can eat as many oranges as you like and take 1 kg home with you. Open areas alternate on weekdays (only 2 open areas). During special seasons, informational booths are set up outside Miurakaigan and Misakiguchi stations. (not staffed on weekdays)

Kinugasayama Park



One of the best spots for cherry blossoms in the prefecture with approximately 2,000 cherry blossom trees and chosen as one of the top 100 places in Japan for cherry blossoms. In Spring, the Kinugasa Sakura Festival draws in a large crowd. You can enjoy all seasons here with walking, running, and more.
