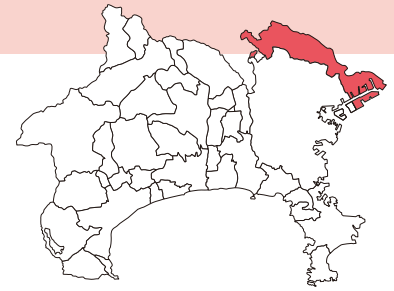

Explanation of Tourist Attraction

One of Kawasaki's amusement spots, drawing crowds from April to December for the nighttime horse races. The final race begins at 8:50 pm, so you can easily stop by even after a day in the office. The racetrack features a meticulously well-maintained grass area where you can watch the races while lying down in the grass, a popular activity for couples and families. Everyone can enjoy themselves, with toys available for young children and the chance to meet miniature horses. There is also a BBQ area where you can enjoy ♪ BBQ during a race. There are events held throughout the year, including yabusame mounted archery in early January and Banba horse-pulled sled racing workshops. Even on days without races, you can purchase tickets for JRA and other horse races - tickets are available for horse races 365 days a year.
