Explanation of Tourist Attraction

The morning market opened in 2010 with just 19 stores and now has grown to close to 200 stores, which makes it the largest morning market in the prefecture. Individually owned private shops must sell handmade products, so people can enjoy the local vegetables, fish, meals, and crafts. There are many unique shops and they are known for their friendly interactions. Open on the 3rd Sunday of every month at Oiso Port from 9:00-14:00 (Jun.-Aug. 17:00 - 20:30)

After you enjoy the market, stroll around the gallery and cafe, and enjoy the Oiso Sunday Art Walk.

Terugasaki Kaigan is located in Oiso, the birthplace of the first beach. It is also selected in the Kanto Fujimi Hyakkei as one of the best sites. It is also designated as a natural treasure in Kanagawa Prefecture as stopover for White-bellied green pigeons in Oiso Terugasaki.

Ever since Haikai poet, Michikaze Oyodo entered the temple, it became one of Japan's Three Largest Haikai Dojos alongside Kyoto's Rakushisha and Shiga's Mumyoan. Currently, you can use the Dojo for the purpose of haiku poetry promotion. (Fees apply)
