Hotoku Ninomiya Shrine



A shrine located in the immediate vicinity of Odawara Castle. It deifies Ninomiya Sontoku who saved a lot of rural areas and clans from poverty in the late Edo period and pursued people's happiness with his own ideals and practicalism. Festivals are held in April and September.

Odawara Castle



Odawara Castle was the residence of the Hojo Clan, which ruled Kanto during the Warring States period. It is widely known for the plum trees, cherry blossom, hydrangea, and other flowers within the park. The exhibits were also recently renewed after the of the castle keep.
