Explanation of Tourist Attraction

A place of beauty made from Hakone's abundant nature and full of light. Enjoy the wide-ranging collection, mainly featuring 19th-century French impressionist paintings, but also including other Western art by Western and Japanese artists, Japanese-style art, Asian ceramics, glass art, and cosmetic items. Be sure to see the most impressive impressionist collection in all of Japan here. There is also a walking path at the Pola Museum of Art, allowing you to walk among nature. It is 670 meters long, and takes about 20 minutes to walk. It is a path for easy walking. This promenade, called style of play promnade, offers a relaxed atmosphere to enjoy art and nature, with beautiful trees and the sounds of the wind and birdsong.

Owakudani



Owakudani is a crater that was left behind when Mount Kamiyama erupted roughly 3,000 years ago - the last volcanic eruption in Hakone. Even today, it emits white smoke containing sulfuric gas, giving you a sense of the force of volcanic activity. *Some parts of the hiking courses are off limits. Please check the website for details.

Komagatake



You can see spectacular views of Mount Fuji and the outer rim of Mount Hakone's crater from the summit. You can also see volcanic plants like the Hakone Kome Azalea at the foot of Komagatake, the central volcanic cone.
