**cu—mo Hakone**

Explanation of Tourist Attraction

cu—mo Hakone is a new spot with a terrace with great scenery and a foot bath opened in July 9th, 2020. It is located on the 2nd floor of Sounzan Station, which connects Hakone Ropeway and Hakone Cable Car. cu—mo shop inside cu—mo Hakone has over 250 items including their original items and their special original food. You can have a photogenic smoothie "New Bell" that was made with clouds in image and "Kumopan (cloud bread)" with fluffy bread on the viewing terrace or while soaking your feet in the footbath.



Selling point



There is a "very tall mailbox" that looks like it is going to reach the sky in cu—mo shop inside. If you purchase their postcard (with their original stamp), you can write a message and send it.

Nearby Sightseeing Spot

**Hakone Ropeway**



The ropeway operates between Owakudani Station and Togendai Station, and it provides sightseeing from 1,000 meters above sea level through to Hakone. Provides views of the different faces of Mt. Fuji throughout all seasons, and on really clear days, it is possible to see the Tokyo Skytree.

**Owakudani**



Owakudani is a site of the Kamiyama crater which was created from the last major eruption of Hakone Volcano 3,000 years ago. Even now, Owakudani sprays a white smoke containing sulfur. From its inhospitable state, you can see where the origins of its name, "Great Hell", came from.
