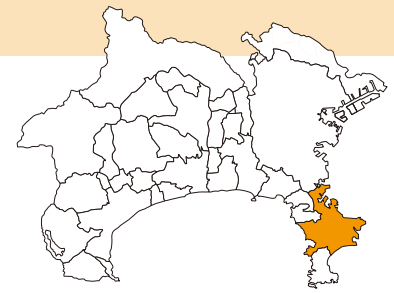

Mikasa Historic Memorial Warship



Explanation of Tourist Attraction

Exhibited at Yokosuka Port, Mikasa is the world's oldest steel battleship. Serving as the flagship of Admiral Heihachiro Togo in the Battle of Japan Sea in the Japanese -Russo War, Mikasa pushed back Russia's Baltic Fleet, securing the Japanese victory. This was the first time that an Asian country defeated a Western power in war.

selling point

This is the oldest steel battleship in existence in the world, and is designated as a Constituent Cultural Property of a Japan Heritage.
