Explanation of Tourist Attraction

Ichijo-Ekan-So was built as a stage for cultural activities in Kyoto's Nishigamo area by Ichijo Ekan, 9th son of the Emperor Go-Yozei, the reigning nobility of the early Edo Period (17th century). In 1959 the building was moved to Kamakura and was designated an important cultural property in 1964. With its rock and dry gardens created in the same way that it would have looked at the time, this is a rare space where one can experience Kyoto while remaining in Kamakura.

From bus stop 5 of Kamakura Station on JR Yokosuka Line, JR Shonan-Sinjuku Line and Enoshima Electric Railway take a Keikyu Highland Junkan Bus (Kama-36 Route) for about 8 minutes. Get off at the Jomyoji bus stop and walk for about 2 minutes.
