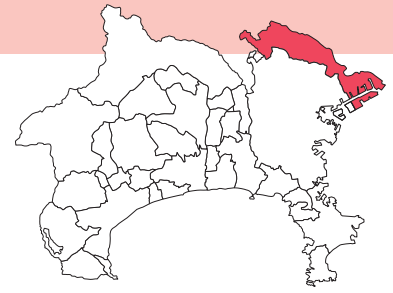

Explanation of Tourist Attraction

Walking on the front approach from Kawasaki Daishi Station, you will see the main gate, Daisanmon. Inside, there is a main temple from the Heian era, rising to 31.5 m high in octagonal shaped five-storied pagoda, with a Yakushido Hall. There is a prayer building for automobile traffic safety in the Taishigawara area on National Route 409. Ritual service, held daily at the main temple, is filled with many visitors seeking to receive prayer for protection from misfortune and their family's. It has long been popular as a master to eradicate all disasters. It is one of the most famous temples known to have more than 10 million visitors annually.

Candy-Cutting Experience



Candy is stretched long (longevity) and good for phlegm removal (dodging misfortune). On the Kawasaki Daishi Road, visitors can hear the rhythmic cutting noise from afar. You can experience candy-cutting at the Matsuyasouhonten.

Inari Shrine, known for worshipping the fox, has 108 stone statues of foxes from kits to a mystical white fox. There are a good luck charms you can only obtain from this shrine.
