# The Museum of Modern Art, Hayama



## Explanation of Tourist Attraction

The Museum of Modern Art is the first public museum of modern art, which was built in Kamakura in 1951. The Hayama hall was built in 2003 for the purpose of storing the art collections used in exhibits. There is Isshiki Beach in the front and Mt. Sangaoka behind it. Surrounded by sea, mountain and glittering light, it is perfectly situated in a bright, open space and quiet living environment. The museum holds several exhibits a year. There are various educational activities and programs for visitors to enjoy.

## Nearby Sightseeing Spot

### Hayama Shiosai Park



Next to the Imperial villa, the land where Hayama Park now sits was once an Imperial riding ground. With Sagami Bay stretching out in front of you and Mt. Fuji and Enoshima ahead, the view from the park is spectacular.

### Hayama Port



Hayama Port lies in the north of the Hayama Coast. Park your car in the parking lot and enjoy a seaside walk to the lighthouse. There are also fishing boats in the harbor.
