Yugawara is a hot spring that has been well known since the Manyo period. Yugawara Art Museum is an art museum that collects artworks that are related to Yugawara, such as those of Seiho Takeuchi, Sotaro Yasui, and Katsumi Miyake. It used to be an old ryokan (Japanese inn) that was renovated in 1998 and opened as "Art Museum Related to Yugawara." Reiji Hiramatsu' public studio opened in the museum in 2017. Enjoy viewing the artworks at a leisurely pace surrounded by soul calming nature.
