Explanation of **Tourist Attraction** Kaiseimachi located on route from Tokyo/Yokohama to Hakone/Odawara. It is famous for its hydrangeas. About 5000 hydrangeas are planted alongside farm roads and waterways running through 17 ha. of rice fields. The flowers perfectly match the rural landscape completely colored in green. Hydrangeas in Kaiseimachi can be seen from early to mid-June. Many events are held at the nearby "Ashigari-go Seto Mansion" (old Japanese-style house built approx. 300 years ago).
