



Odawara Lacquerware, one of the three major crafts of Kanagawa, originated in the Muromachi period (1336-1573) and gained widespread recognition as practical lacquerware during the Edo period (1603-1868).

Crafted primarily from zelkova, this lacquerware stands out for its distinctive lacquering technique, which highlights the natural beauty of the wood grain and showcases the robustness of the zelkova material.

The tour includes a visit to the workshop of Mr. Hajime Okawa, a third-generation lacquer craftsman who is among the few keeping the tradition alive.


