Oyama has been an object of mountain worship since ancient times. Some 200,000 people are said to have visited the mountain each year during the Edo era, known as "Oyama Pilgrimage".

Oyama Afuri Jinja Shrine is located at the halfway point of Oyama. The view from the shrine is spectacular and has earned two stars in the Michelin Green Guide Japan. Even today, Oyama continues to attract throngs of visitors.

Special Program 1

Saryo Sekison, the cafe adjoining Oyama Afuri Jinja Shrine is fully reserved, so you can have the two Michelin-starred view that Oyama is renowned for all to yourself. A miko, or shrine maiden, guides you to the shrine by chartered cable car. The shrine is at an elevation of 700 meters.

Kagura is a style of Shinto dance performed to express gratitude and prayers to the gods. The dance will be performed exclusively by shrine priestesses for you at the sacred Oyama Afuri Jinja Shrine.
